Background

Although the numbers of mpox cases in NZ are low there is an ongoing global outbreak and there were ~1400 cases in Australia in 2024. The mpox vaccine is recommended and FREE for people (aged 18 years and over) at highest risk of infection this is:

- Gay, bisexual and other men who have sex with men (MSM)
- Transgender, cisgender and non-binary people who have sex with MSM
- Sexual partners and people who live in the same household of people uninfected with Mpox at risk
 of Mpox infection because they are gay, bisexual and other men who have sex with men (GBMSM),
 transgender or non-binary people with certain high-risk indications

People aged under 18 and at risk of getting mpox, can receive the vaccine but need a prescription from their doctor.

Mpox vaccine

Two doses of the Jynneos vaccine are recommended, a minimum of 30 days apart. Protection starts from two weeks after your first dose. Jynneos is a third-generation live, **non-replicating** vaccine (used for smallpox and mpox) that is safe to use in those with immunocompromise, including those living with HIV.

Jynneos vaccine effectiveness measured in 2022 is ~76% (95% CI 64-88%) after one dose and 82% (72-92%) after two doses in predominantly GBMSM aged 18-49 years.

Breakthrough cases following vaccination are mostly mild with low number of lesions. Reinfection has also been described. The vaccine can decrease severity of illness, risk for hospitalisation, and even death among those who are immunocompromised. People previously vaccinated against smallpox are still recommended to have a full two-dose course as efficacy wanes over time.
